- Aides Delegates with the Rules of Procedure
- Acts Impartially and in Good Faith

Point of Order

- A member may interrupt debate at any time by addressing the Chair and stating a desire to raise a point of order. <u>Such action is only taken to ensure orderly</u> <u>procedure.</u>
- A point of order may refer to such matters as a breach or violation of the Rules of Procedure or of the By-Laws. It may be raised when a speaker is not confining their remarks to the motion before the Chair.
